- They complain about racial discrimination
- · They do not get fair treatment from the police
- They earn less than other workers doing the same jobs
- They are usually offered especially menial jobs
- They want to become British/Italian citizens
- They want to bring relatives into the country (a spouse, a children)
- They want to use state services or claim benefits, for example, education, health services, council, housing, social security benefits, council tax benefits...

An experience with an immigrant

A family of immigrants live near our school... there are two lovely children, Maisha and Peter with their mum and dad. Each morning, before coming to school, we speak to them and they tell us how was their life in Congo. Their parents had not a job there, so they came here in Italy.
